The Lions Service Rally Kick-Off on Saturday, January 4th, was a powerful day of community service in the Greater Phoenix area. Lions clubs from across the Valley gathered to make a meaningful impact, demonstrating their dedication to serving others.

FANOGCS proudly participated in the event, offering vital sign assessments, blood sugar checks, and health education to attendees. The day began on an energetic note with a morning Zumba session led by Ajay Manabat, setting the tone for an uplifting and service-filled event.

It's truly inspiring to see an entire community come together, volunteering their time, talents, and skills to make a difference.

In 2021, as Afghanistan descended into chaos, thousands of families were forced to make the heartbreaking decision to flee their homeland in search of safety. Among them was a young couple and their 8-year-old daughter, who boarded an overcrowded Airbus with nothing more than hope in their hearts and the clothes on their backs.

Shortly after arriving in the United States, the father became ill and was admitted to CRMC. It was there that Amy, a member of FANOGCS, crossed paths with the family. As she learned their story, it became clear they had no one — no friends, no relatives, and no support system in a new and unfamiliar land. The mother, still nursing their daughter, shared that they weren't allowed to bring any extra clothing due to the limited weight allowed on the evacuation flight. (continued on page 5)

Amy's heart was moved. Without hesitation, she reached out to the FANOGCS community — and what happened next was nothing short of incredible. Clothing, toys, and even financial assistance began pouring in. What started as a call for help turned into a wave of compassion that wrapped the family in warmth and dignity.

By Christmas of 2022, the FANOGCS family had officially adopted the refugees as their foster family, offering not just material help, but love, friendship, and belonging. Through government assistance and continued support from FANOGCS, the family slowly found their footing. They eventually moved into a home of their own — a symbol of their new beginning.

But the bond didn't end there. FANOGCS, led by Amy, committed to visiting them twice a year, a small act that meant the world to a family rebuilding their lives from scratch. In December, during one of these visits, the joy was even greater as they celebrated the birthdays of not just one, but two daughters — the family had now grown to five.

This story is more than just a refugee's journey — it is a reminder that even the smallest act of kindness can create ripples of hope. It is a testament to the power of community, of stepping up when others are down, and of choosing compassion over comfort.

FANOGCS continues to shine as a light in the darkness, proving that when people come together with open hearts, lives can be changed — and sometimes, strangers can become family.

Batanes Provincial Health Office Expresses Gratitude to FANOGCS for Lifesaving Support

The Batanes Provincial Health Office has extended heartfelt thanks to the Filipino-American Nurses Organization of Grand Canyon State (FANOGCS) through a formal announcement on their official website. This gesture of gratitude comes in recognition of FANOGCS's generous financial and logistical support that made a vital community outreach program possible.

On January 8 and January 14, 2025, FANOGCS partnered with the Batanes Provincial Health Office, under the leadership of Dr. Allan Sande, to bring much-needed healthcare services to the people of Batanes. The medical mission, conducted using their state-of-the-art medical bus, offered free medical consultations, treatments, dental care, and laboratory services to underserved communities.

In addition to healthcare services, the Health Office also provided free essential medicines and vitamins, focusing on the most vulnerable populations—children, pregnant women, and senior citizens. Their presence was not just a one-time event but a lasting commitment: free medical services will continue to be delivered every Wednesday across various small towns in Batanes, starting in the humble village of Imnajbu, Uyugan.

This partnership is a powerful example of how compassion, collaboration, and innovation can bring real change to communities in need. With continued efforts from organizations like FANOGCS, access to quality healthcare is no longer just a dream—it's becoming a reality for the people of Batanes.
